This is in response to your letter dated April 15, 2008, the CBSA International Events and Conventions Services Program (IECSP) has officially recognized your event and granted permission to import goods for this event:

## 2008 AAPT Summer Meeting

(pre-conferences starting July 12, 2008) July 19 -23, 2008 University of Alberta Edmonton, Alberta

You have advised that you are expecting 45 - 50 exhibitors who will be importing the following goods into Canada: educational materials, display equipment, and science related goods has been noted that you expect approximately 1200 delegates, 15% of whom will be Canadian and 85% will be U.S. or other. This event is **open** to the public for a limited time on Tuesday, July 22, 2008 only.

Goods for this event may be temporarily imported under the provisions of tariff item no. 9993.00.00.00 so long as the goods will be exported at the end of the event. Canada Border Services Agency may require documentation on a Temporary Admission Permit, form E29B, or on an A.T.A. Carnet. Goods for sale or consumption in Canada, which will remain in Canada, are subject to regular customs duties and taxes. . Goods imported temporarily cannot be imported for lease, sale or further manufacturing or processing. At the time of importation, the importer must specify the use to which the goods will be put while in Canada. The goods must be exported within a reasonable time after the conclusion of the event.

Move-in will take place on July 20, 2008 and move-out will be July 22, 2008. You have appointed Livingston Event Logistics as your "Official Customs Broker" for this event. 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Your request for "Border to Show" is authorized. This allows importers/exhibitors using the services of the assigned event broker the option to move their goods directly to the event site where the broker and/or Customs will be on-site to collect the importation documents. Those exhibitors not using the broker's service must make arrangements to self-clear the goods through the Customs importation process.

Permanent residents or citizens of the United States do not need a passport or visa to enter Canada, however they must carry proof of their citizenship. Persons seeking admission to Canada other than citizens and permanent residents of the United States will be required to be in possession of a valid passport. Citizens of certain countries may require a visitor visa in order to enter Canada. For information on these and other Immigration issues, you may wish to contact Immigration officials at the nearest Canadian Embassy, High Commission or Consulate. In addition to those requirements, exhibitors or participants who are not Canadian should also carry a copy of this letter to facilitate their entry into Canada.

To facilitate customs procedures at the time of entry into Canada, we suggest a copy of this letter be given to each person who is importing goods for this occasion and that they be in possession of an *itemized list* of articles stating description, quantity and value for presentation to the Canada Border Services Agency officials. A copy of this letter should also accompany each shipment of goods to the event.
