Application Materials Barbara Lotze Scholarship For Future Teachers

The executive Board of the American Association of Physics Teachers is pleased to administer the Barbara Lotze Scholarship for Future Teachers. This scholarship is funded by the Barbara Lotze Endowment for the advancement of physics education in the United States and is intended to encourage students to become well prepared high school physics teachers.

AAPT will award scholarships in the amount of \$2,000 each; the number of scholarships awarded will depend on available funding.

Students who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply for the Barbara Lotze Scholarship for Future Teachers. Applicants must declare their intent to prepare for, and engage in, a career in physics teaching at the high school level and must, at the time the scholarship funds are received by the student, be:

- an undergraduate student enrolled in an accredited two-year college, four-year college or a university; or a high school senior accepted for such enrollment.
- pursuing, or planning to pursue, a course of study leading toward a career in physics teaching in the high schools.
- showing promise of success in their studies, and
- a citizen of the United States of America.

All applicants will be given full consideration without regard to gender, race, color, creed or ethnic origin. It is a stipulation of the grant that, all other considerations being equal, an applicant from Allegheny College is to be given preference. The scholarships may be awarded to the same individuals more than once, but no more than four years. Awardees will need to re-apply in order to be considered for additional awards.

It is the responsibility of the applicant to see that these letters are provided in a timely fashion and by the application deadline.

- A. Transcripts of all relevant academic work.
- B. A letter to the Scholarship Committee stating why you believe you should be considered for this scholarship. Please include evidence of your commitment to teaching. This evidence may be tutoring, serving as a TA, assisting a K-12 teacher or faculty member, performing outreach activities to K-12 schools, etc. Also include a description of the pathway you plan to use for licensure such as the curriculum and education courses you plan to or are currently taking, special programs such as Teach for America, etc.
- C. Proof of U.S.A. citizenship (for example: copy of birth certificate).

Applications will be accepted at any time and will be considered for recommendation to the Executive Board at the time of each AAPT winter meeting. Applications for which all materials, including letters of recommendation, have been received by the chair on or before *December 1* will be considered for recommendation at the following winter meeting of the Executive Board.
